California Style Jungle Primaries...

Trample Your Freedoms

- They contradict the freedom of association found in Political Parties.
- Independents are already free to join parties during the primary, why should they make decisions for party members?

Are More Chaotic

- Question 3 allows for potentially dozens of candidates in a single race.
- Completing a ballot is longer and more confusing.
- Tabulating votes is significantly delayed and mistakes are common.

Are Open to Manipulation

- Rival parties can sabotage which candidates are chosen.
- Party platforms become irrelevant.
- · Voter confusion skyrockets.

Don't let Jungle Primaries change how we carry out elections.

What Rank Choice Voting Looks Like

A ranked choice ballot requires very detailed completion otherwise there is a risk of it being invalidated.

Instructions to Voters

To vote, fill in the oval like this

To rank your candidate choices, fill in the oval:

- In the 1st column for your 1st choice candidate.
- In the 2nd column for your 2nd choice candidate, and so on.

Continue until you have ranked as many or as few candidates as you like

Fill in no more than one oval for each candidate or column.

To rank a write-in candidate, write the person's name in the write-in space and fill in the oval for the ranking of your choice.
